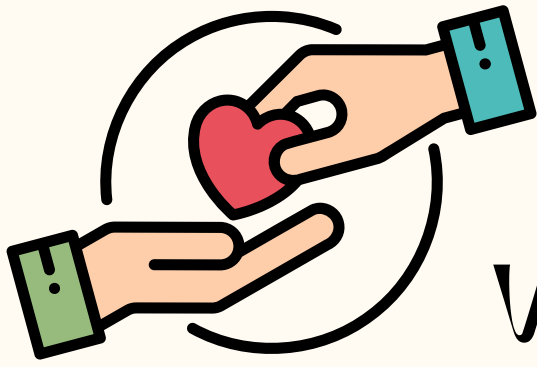

## Sermon points

3. The Purple of Compromise: When we blend the "blue" and "red" of opposing viewpoints through respectful dialogue and mutual understanding, we create a beautiful "purple" of community. This metaphor encourages us to seek common ground and appreciate the value in diverse perspectives.
4. Kindness as a Radical Act: In a world where even retail stores need signs asking for basic respect, choosing kindness becomes a powerful, countercultural action. By actively practicing kindness, especially towards those who disagree with us, we embody Christ's love in a tangible way.
5. Guarding Relationships Against Political Division: The story of the couple divided by political differences serves as a cautionary tale about the dangers of letting politics overshadow our shared humanity. It calls us to prioritize our relationships and shared values over political affiliations, fostering unity in our families and communities.
